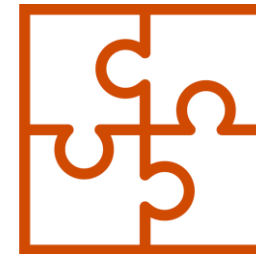

Definition ESG

ESG stands for Environmental, Social, and Governance. It refers to a breadth of non-financial factors (many of which have demonstrable financial impact) that companies are increasingly incorporating into their strategies & decision making structures

Environmental

- CO₂ emissions & climate change
- Land use & loss of biodiversity
- Water consumption & pollution
- Waste & hazardous material

Governance

- Critical incident risk management
- Anti-corruption & anti-bribery
- Transparency on non-financial aspects

Social

- Human rights
- Health & safety
- Labor rights
- Sustainable workforce
- Diversity and Inclusion
- Cybersecurity, data privacy & digital responsibility



ESG does not only concern an organisation's own operations, but the FULL value chain it influences

Need for **insight and transparency**

E.g. social accountability on ESG topics and insight into the climate impact of organizations.



Desire to **steer the renewal** towards proactive management of environmental, social and governance topics.

E.g. change in structure of the various roles that the government can take (e.g. stimulating, directing, agenda-setting) and the design of public-private or public-public partnerships.

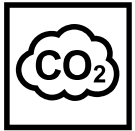


Transition to **development and realization of sustainable projects.**
